
Summary

The Federal Emergency Management Agency's National Continuity Programs, Continuity of Operations Division created a short survey to assess Federal continuity training needs. The survey was sent via e-mail to Federal continuity practitioners on April 20, 2011. Recipients were given until April 30, 2011 to complete the survey. A total of 61 recipients responded to the nine-question survey though not all questions were answered by all respondents.




- 1) Do the current resident courses offered by the Emergency Management Institute (EMI) meet your Continuity needs? (61 responses)




2) Would holding more resident courses in the National Capital Region vice EMI be beneficial to your organization? (61 responses)




3) Are there any Continuity topics that should have dedicated courses developed for training? (57 responses)
